

Sign Up for the City's Emergency Notification System



Have you signed up for CodeRed? In a continuing effort to improve communication with residents and businesses during emergency situations, the City contracts with CodeRED, an emergency notification system that allows for public safety personnel to quickly deliver emergency alerts.

The system enables the City to send important alerts with phone calls, text messages, and emails as well as broadcasts through the CodeRED mobile alert app. The City uses the system to notify residents in specific areas of police and fire emergencies,

hazardous conditions, road maintenance, missing children notices, and other critical information.

CodeRED provided the City with an initial database of residential and business telephone numbers; however, all residents are encouraged to visit www.claytonmo.gov/codered and click on the CodeRED logo to add additional contact information including cell phone numbers, text and email addresses.

No one should assume they have been automatically added to the emergency contact database.

Sign Up to Receive Weather Warnings

With CodeRed Weather Warnings, you will receive an immediate call with warning information whenever the National Weather Service issues a severe thunderstorm, tornado or flash flood warning that is forecasted to impact your address. Due to the accuracy of this system, you will not receive calls for weather warnings outside the path of the address you register.

City Launches MyClayton App



The City of Clayton recently launched its new MyClayton app. MyClayton is free and provides you with a mobile connection to the City of Clayton.

MyClayton allows you to easily report issues you find throughout your neighborhood and our community. The MyClayton app enables you to reports issues such as sidewalk repairs, code enforcement, damaged street signs, garbage pickup, and much more!

Once an issue has been reported, you can track the issue until it has been resolved.

The MyClayton app also connects you to our business directory to help you quickly find location and contact information for local restaurants, retail shops and more.

MyClayton is free to download and is available from the Apple Store and Google Play by searching "MyClayton".

"Clayton: a history" written by Dickson Terry was published in 1976. This 300 page documentary of Clayton from its earliest days was commissioned in 1974 by Mayor James Laflin and the Clayton Board of Aldermen to celebrate the bicentennial of the United States and the centennial of the

establishment of Clayton as a community. I recently read it for the second time and enjoyed it as much as the first time.

To quote a part of the foreword by Mayor Laflin in 1976, "This is a history of people-the people who have contributed to the establishment of Clayton as a community and to its development as an outstanding city in these United States. As a community, Clayton typifies the best of grass-roots America and exemplifies the fundamental principles of self-government".

From the dirt streets and wooden plank sidewalks of the 1800's to the center of commerce, justice and education that it is today, Clayton owes its success to the dedication of a long list of people who have influenced our community – the elected officials, the residents, the corporate citizens and the visitors who combine to make Clayton the special place that it is.

"As we continue to mark our place locally, nationally and internationally, our history continues to be a part of our present and future."

At the recent groundbreaking of the Centene Centre project, I noted that the earth that we were shoveling was the same earth that Martin Hanley plowed over 150 years ago.

That historical connection is not lost on your elected officials as we diligently scrutinize the issues that face our community. In 1948, then Mayor Ken Thies stated, "not a single city in the United States claims to have solved the parking problem" and, while "parking" continues to be a topic of conversation in Clayton, we continue to develop solutions, most recently in new wayfinding signage and the new PassportParking app. I hope you find the signage useful and urge you to download the PassportParking app for your smart phone.



A design team, led by Jacobs Engineering, is currently working on the design for the rink and associated building. Are you enjoying 50% off the hourly parking rate in PassportParking as a Clayton resident? If not, visit claytonpermits.rmcpay.com today to get started! Simply create an account and upload proof of residency. Once approved, log in to Passport using the license plate number you included on the application to receive the discount. Time limits and a convenience fee will apply.

In addition to the resident discount, you can also enjoy the ability to extent parking sessions without returning to your vehicle and cancel your session if you don't use the entire time.


[CITY UPDATE]



As part of the City's pavement maintenance program, several subdivisions will be resurfaced this summer: Hillcrest, Wydown Forest, and the Moorlands (see map). Construction is expected to take place April-September.

Subdivision residents will be notified by mail prior to the start of work in each subdivision. Letters will contain a link to the City's website with a current project schedule, project contact information, as well as information about what to expect and how you can help during construction. Due to weather, and other unforeseen circumstances, the project schedule may be revised as the project progresses.

Other infrastructure improvements taking place this summer include:

- Sidewalk repairs and roadway crack sealing (currently underway).
- The annual curb ramp project, which is paid by the Community Development Block Grant, will address select non-compliant ADA ramps in the Central Business District.

Continued Replacement of Aging Water Mains

Missouri American Water (MOAW) is continuing to replace aging water mains throughout the City and is working to complete water main replacements in Hillcrest, Wydown Forest and the Moorlands by early to mid-summer in advance of repaving. MOAW will provide notifications to residents regards the project and for any service interruptions. The typical order of work you are likely to see for these water main replacements includes...

- · Water main installation (usually in the street).
- Residential/Business service line taps to new water main (in area behind curb).
- Restoration of the pavement, areas behind curb in the right of way and private property.

Metropolitan Sewer District Improvements



The Metropolitan Sewer District (MSD) is scheduled to complete Project Clear Initiative improvements in Wydown Forest and the Moorlands by the end of July.

This work will include downspout disconnections of some properties and modifications to the sewer system lines.

City staff has coordinated with Missouri American Water and MSD since last fall and the companies are scheduled to complete these utility improvements prior to street repaving.
