

## **How To Control Rats In Your Neighborhood**

## **Eliminate Food Sources**

- 1. Do not allow bird seed to accumulate under feeders. Remove feeders if rat activity is identified on your or your neighbor's property.
- 2. Use metal or heavy duty plastic garbage cans with tight fitting lids. Replace garbage cans with cracks, holes or missing lids.
- 3. Remove fruit and nuts that have fallen from trees on your property. Fruits and vegetables from gardens should be picked up promptly when ripened.
- 4. Remove pet food dishes and leftovers promptly after feeding. Do not leave pet food outside overnight. Remove pet waste frequently.

## **Remove Harborage Areas**

- 1. Store lumber, firewood and other materials at least eighteen (18) inches off the ground.
- 2. Groundcover, landscaping and dense vegetation provide harborage. Monitor these areas for signs of rat activity or remove them.
- 3. Seal any openings to your home and garage. These include garage door seals, openings where utilities enter, dryer vents and floor drains.

## **Use Effective Extermination Methods**

- 1. Rat burrows should be baited with EPA approved rodenticide pellets, <u>following the label directions</u>. For questions about bait station location, please call St. Louis County Vector Control at 314-727-3097.
- 2. If burrows cannot be located, locked bait stations containing rodenticide blocks should be placed in areas where rat activity is located.
- 3. If residents prefer, they can hire a private pest control service to treat their property for them. Be sure that any professional you use is licensed, bonded and certified.
